FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK



Welcome to RTC's Newsletter, Reflection on 2023!

This newsletter hopes to provide a window into the events of the year. We are honoured and humbled to receive the only A+ accreditation in Bhutan, for the second time, fulfilling another institutional milestone and setting a continued benchmark for RTC's future.

Throughout the year, life at RTC was vibrant with various co-curricular activities, college plays, music, dance performances, talent shows, and sports. Both men's and women's football clubs excelled at their sport. A vibrant showcase of student work and projects encompassing photos, videos, and research presentations livened up the campus. Furthermore, students contributed to meaningful community services including blood drives and clean-ups in our Thimphu and Gelephu campuses, and provided entertainment programmes for the elderly at the Gakid village. Her Majesty the Queen Mother Dorji Wangmo Wangchuck graced the launch of the RTC Tarayana club and the college hosted the Presidential debate for the 4th parliamentary elections.

We are back on track in terms of our internationalisation programme. We oversaw 59 incoming guests from our partnerships (from 30 Universities) and 56 reciprocal RTC outbound mobilities (to 28 Universities). Our semester-long/regular international students are on the rise. We also have 7 RTC students attending various year-long study programmes in Europe and the US. We have resumed our faculty-led credit programmes with Edith Cowan University in April, University of California, Davis in August, and Colorado Mountain College in November.

Our CITL (Center for Innovative Teaching and Learning) co-hosted the 2nd National Conference for Higher Education at Samtse College of Education in May and held the first 'Basic Pedagogy Training' for 25 health science professional educators from 4 institutes in the country in November. The Rational Expectations Economics Society (REES) successfully held the Re-thinking Economics Conference (26-28 October) with the students and faculty from Sri Venkateswara College, University of Delhi. RTC also organised a business and entrepreneurship festival along with the International Day celebration on the 31st October. The Himalayan Centre for Environmental Humanities (HCEH) commenced two multiple-year research projects. One is titled: "Living with Uncertainty in South Asian Mountains" and is in collaboration with the Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences. The other is titled SUCCESS, which is an acronym for "Successful Intervention Pathways for Migration as Adaptation", and is in partnership with the International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development (ICIMOD) and the International Development Research Centre (IDRC). HCEH also organised a distinguished guest lecture by Professor T.B. Subba, the former Vice-Chancellor of Sikkim Central University.

As in previous years, our college leadership has participated in engaging our community in purpose-building, learning-to-learn sessions for freshmen, leadership orientations, Search Inside Yourself (SIY) workshops for student leaders and graduating nursing students, mock drills for earthquake preparedness, and safety training for fire hazards. These activities added depth to the care and nurturing of the RTC community. A grand graduation day celebration marked the farewell of 406 students. Seventeen graduates were selected for the civil service; among them, five were in the top ten! Tshering Deki, Sonam Chuki, and Pelden Lhamo were recognised as 1st, 5th, and 10th in the Technical (env) category respectively. Phurpa Gyeltshen ranked 2nd in the PGDFM, and Pema Dechen, ranked 10th in Nursing. We celebrate the accomplishments of our graduates who sat for the BCSE (Bhutan Civil Service Examinations) 2023! Additionally, the University of New England (Australia) honoured me with the Distinguished Alumni Award for 2023, acknowledging my leadership in promoting inclusive education and positive organisational culture in Bhutan.

The year 2023 was filled with significant accomplishments for the RTC community. I thank the entire RTC community for their commitment to strive for excellence and to continue inspiring education in Bhutan. I look forward to yet another fulfilling year ahead.

AWARD






The Royal Thimphu College family congratulated our President, Tshewang Tandin, for being selected as a recipient of the prestigious Distinguished Alumni Awards, 2023, conferred by the University of New England, Australia.

The awards were presented to distinguished alumni who made significant contributions to their field; demonstrated outstanding leadership and UNE's values of creativity, innovation, access, and inclusion. They embodied characteristics of honesty, ethical behaviour, and authenticity. They inspired future generations of graduates.

Professor Sanjeev Mehta was awarded the Pravasi Bharatiya Samman Award for his contribution in education. Professor Mehta is currently serving as the Programme Leader of Development Economics at Royal Thimphu College and is a renowned economist on Bhutanese topics. He has served Bhutan in various capacities as a teacher, researcher, curriculum developer, newspaper columnist and consultant to the government and international organisations.

He is considered as a role model and has received 'His Majesty's National Order of Merit, Silver Medal' in 2014. In his recent book on Bhutanese economy titled 'The Dragon Economy: An Experiment with Happiness', he has also documented India's contribution to Bhutan's development.

INTERNATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES



In addition to the 7 RTC students studying on academic exchanges to the USA and Europe, Royal Thimphu College was able to send 56 teaching and non-teaching staff on short-term outbound mobilities to 28 universities in Europe this year. The Erasmus+ programme for higher education funded by the European Union supports teaching and administrative staff to take part in professional development focused on teaching and training abroad. This creates an international learning experience for all involved.

The Erasmus+ mobility partnerships and capacity-building projects were initiated at RTC in 2017. They involve the exchanges of staff and students between partner universities and long-term projects. It serves as an opportunity for RTC and the host institutions to plan future collaborative programmes and explore areas for joint academic projects. The mobilities also contributed to the growth of their intercultural competencies. We look forward to future collaborations between the institutions.

Since 2010, RTC has sent over 276 Bhutanese students abroad for short and long-term exchanges including cultural and academic mobilities. RTC has also received over 450 international faculty and students for inbound exchanges.

International Students





RTC welcomed nine incoming international students on campus during the Spring semester. We were happy to host semester study-abroad students from our partners - API Study Abroad - Academic Programmes International, Hungarian University of Agriculture and Life Sciences, MATE - formerly SZIU (Hungary), Quest University (Canada), and DHBW Ravensburg (Germany). Our independent semester study-abroad students hailed from Denmark, Australia, and the USA.

The college believes that a multicultural environment contributes to the breadth of opportunities for all students. It is a substantial benefit for everyone in terms of cross-cultural learning.

During the fall semester, 17 new international students joined the three students who decided to prolong their stay at RTC beyond the Spring semester. We were happy to host the new semester study-abroad students from our partner universities; Wheaton College Massachusetts, Centre College, Pitzer College and API Study Abroad in the USA. We also welcomed other new study-abroad and full-degree international students from Switzerland, Belgium, Netherlands, France, Australia, and Japan.

RTC ENCORE Project Milestone 2023: A Year of Achievement and Innovation

The final year of the ENCORE project saw remarkable milestones: RTC students pitched business case studies for the Local Business Case Challenge; the Entrepreneurship Knowledge Centre (EKC) organised 10 entrepreneurial training programmes for the students; Mr. Madhav Verma, lead of the project, presented a paper on "Assessment of Entrepreneurship Ecosystem in Bhutan, Nepal, and Lao" in Finland; and a joint publication from 6 partner universities showcased the achievements of the winning teams in the Local Case Challenge. Additionally, the final project management meeting and conference in Laos was attended by RTC's focal ENCORE project team members along with the two Continuing Education students who won RTC's Local Business Case Challenge. The RTC team is extremely proud of nearly completing the three-year project successfully.

HAPPY Project's Milestones since January 2023

The HAPPY EU team from Vrije University Amsterdam, the University of Ljubljana, the Institute for Innovation and Development of the University of Ljubljana (IRI UL), and Leiden University, completed their visit to Royal Thimphu College on October 11, 2023. The visit encompassed several key activities, including a review of external evaluations, planning for ongoing HAPPY initiatives, and conducting of parallel workshops at RTC. These workshops covered subjects such as 'Research Writing,' 'Visual Ethnography,' and 'Designing and implementing People-Centred Stakeholder Projects' hosted by RTC.

Additionally, the team made significant progress in finalising the procurement of resources and equipment for phase 2 of the project. Furthermore, the team diligently worked on the planning and organisation of forthcoming efforts, aiming to enhance qualitative research skills and knowledge in Bhutan.

Dasho spoke to the students on leadership, governance, and the role of youth in the future of Bhutan and presented His Majesty's Certificates for Academic Excellence to the academic toppers of the year 2020-2021.

Royal Thimphu College was honoured by the visit from His Excellency Sudhakar Dalela, Ambassador of India to Bhutan, for a Distinguished Guest Lecture on the 31st of May. His Excellency addressed the students on the 'India-Bhutan Partnership: Charting Future Trajectory Together'. The event concluded with a question and answer session followed by a reception attended by the management and faculty.





RTC was honoured to receive the <u>National Aeronautics and Space Administration</u> (NASA) team led by SERVIR project manager Tony Kim and officials from the US Embassy in New Delhi. The team engaged with the BSc Environmental Management students with a talk on 'NASA connecting Space to the World including Bhutan'.

The NASA team discussed what NASA is doing right now on space exploration and then talked about their work with Bhutan, the SERVIR project on using satellite data to address critical challenges in food security, water resources, weather and climate, land use, and natural disasters.

RTC Student Research Symposium





The first annual common RTC Student Research Symposium was successfully held on the 16th of June. A total of 20 presenters shared their final year research works and projects from six programmes (Developmental Economics, Political Science & Sociology, Anthropology, Mass Communication, English Studies, and Environmental Management).

The event aimed at providing a platform to showcase the hard work of students in producing excellent theses from their undergraduate research experiences. The programme was sponsored by WWF Bhutan as a Living Planet Session under the Education for Nature Programme. It was attended by faculty and staff, students from respective programmes, and external guests including the presenter's parents. The event concluded with presenters receiving certificates of excellence in undergraduate research.

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)





On March 13th, 2023, the <u>Bhutan Olympic Committee</u> (BOC) and the Royal Thimphu College signed a revised Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the 'RTC-BOC Sports Scholarship Programme'. The new MoU includes an increased number of scholarships from 6 slots to 10 slots annually, in the newly established Bachelor of Sports and Health Sciences Programme. The RTC and BOC will also ensure that the national athletes are better supported, both academically and in their respective sport disciplines. It is necessary to ensure continuation of their training and to cope better with the academic rigor of college education.

The BOC and the RTC will work in partnership with the National Sport Federations. The initiative was first conceived in 2012 by His Royal Highness Prince Jigyel Ugyen Wangchuck, President of the BOC, to offer a platform for national athletes to pursue their academic aspirations and continue their sport training, so as to better represent the country in international competitions.

Advocacy







In commemoration of World Health Day, the students and the faculty members of the BSc Nursing and Midwifery programme organised a Health Fair on the 7th of April. Free health screening was provided along with awareness of adolescent-friendly health services and health education.



Royal Thimphu College collaboration with the Jigme Dorji Wangchuck National Referral Hospital, hosted its 27th Blood Donation Drive on November 8. The event saw 100 active donors and 53 deferred participants, demonstrating a strong commitment to the cause.

Young Minds, Bold Ideas: Promoting the Handicrafts Sector in Bhutan was organised by the Mass Communication programme at RTC in collaboration with the <u>Handicrafts Association of Bhutan</u> (HAB) on 9th June as a part of the Advocacy Series.

The event showcased the rich heritage and craftsmanship of Bhutan while advocating for entrepreneurship in the handicrafts sector.

Exhibition



On November 23rd, the 2nd year nursing students organised a Nutrition Exhibition in the Central Regional Referral Hospital (CRRH), Gelephu. RTC FC





Search Inside Yourself (SIY) workshop



The graduating nursing students attended a two-day Search Inside Yourself (SIY) workshop on the 26th and 27th of May. The workshop was facilitated by our SIY-certified teachers: Mr. Tshewang Tandin President of RTC and two faculty members, Mr. Tshewang Dorji and Mr. Tika Ram Sharma.

Search Inside Yourself (SIY) is a mindfulness-based Emotional Intelligence curriculum developed by Search Inside Yourself Leadership Institute (SIYLI). The main aim of SIY is to help people develop the skills of mindfulness, empathy, compassion, and overall emotional intelligence to create the conditions for individual and collective thriving.

Currently, the SIY programme is taught, learnt, and practiced in more than 150 cities and 50 countries around the world.

Student Leadership Workshop



The Student Services Department (SSD) conducted a 2-day Leadership Workshop for student leaders including Student Government Officials, Resident Assistants (RAs), and Club Coordinators. SSD designed the workshop to enhance their leadership and planning skills. The workshop covers topics such as leadership principles, effective communication, team dynamics, and event planning through interactive sessions. The goal is to empower student leaders for their roles in shaping the campus environment.





RTC PICKLEBALL CLUB





Royal Thimphu College celebrated its pioneering role as one of the first Pickleball destinations in Bhutan, showcasing the sport's rapid global growth. Pickleball, a dynamic paddle sport is a blending elements of tennis, badminton, and ping-pong, has captivated players of all ages and skill levels with its straightforward rules.

The RTC Pickleball Club, a testament to this enthusiasm will commence full operation in Spring 2024. It further solidifies the college's commitment to providing diverse and engaging sports opportunities. The conference saw diverse research topics, insights and findings through presentations and discussions. The team from RTC presented three research papers.

Disaster Management







On October 25th, Royal Thimphu College conducted a Disaster Awareness Day featuring an earthquake drill and a fire hazard awareness programme with 821 participants, including students and staff. The drill aimed to instill a culture of preparedness.

Additionally, a focused fire hazard session with a live demonstration by the <u>Royal Bhutan Police</u> provided practical insights. The initiative successfully equipped the participants with essential knowledge, fostering a heightened sense of preparedness within the college community.
